



ABSOLUTORIUM

Óbuda University Doctoral and Habilitation Regulations

effective as of January 1, 2026 – excerpt

13. § (5) Doctoral students who have earned 240 credits and fulfilled all their reporting obligations, including the comprehensive examination, shall receive a final certificate (absolutorium). The absolutorium is a prerequisite for applying for a doctoral degree, but it does not certify either graduation or a doctoral degree.

D2) Doctoral credit regulations

(2) Doctoral training consists of 8 semesters. Credits can be earned in the training based on the following activities:
Studies, i.e., completion of courses (subjects);
Reporting activities;
Research activities (publications, participation in projects); Teaching activities.

During the 8 semesters, students must earn 240 credit points to obtain their degree.

A maximum of 60 credits from theoretical courses can be taken into account in the degree.

ATDI: 8 compulsory 6-credit subjects

At least 75 credits must be earned through publications related to the research topic. When evaluating publication activity, only data published in the Hungarian Scientific Works Repository (MTMT) can be taken into account, as follows:

Scientific articles; in the Doctoral School of Materials Science and Technology, co-authors who do not hold a PhD share the points in proportion to their participation as stated in their declaration:

Peer-reviewed journal article

With IF 36 credits

Without IF, published abroad 24 credits

Without IF, published domestically 18 credits

Peer-reviewed conference paper (min. 4 pages) in a publication with an ISBN number, in printed or electronic form

in a foreign language 24 credits in

Hungarian 6 credits

Scientific book or book excerpt (the score is divided by the number of non-lead authors): Published abroad, in a foreign language, at least 10 pages, not a conference publication 24 credits Published in Hungary, per 20 full pages

in a foreign language 3.6 credits in

Hungarian 1.8 credits

In the case of teaching activities, 1 hour of practical training or seminar per week (over one semester) is worth 1-2 credits. The

number of credits that can be earned through teaching activities cannot exceed 60 credits.
